# The School Safety Challenge & Types of Funding

## Why Funding Is Needed

Approximately **2.1 million U.S. students** currently vape, with **1.63 million** using e-cigarettes daily. Vaping incidents overwhelmingly occur in privacy-sensitive areas like bathrooms and locker rooms where traditional video surveillance cannot be deployed.

Modern vape detection technology provides an effective solution, but comprehensive coverage requires multiple units campus-wide—costs that quickly become prohibitive for budget-strapped schools.

Beyond vaping, schools face additional safety challenges. Effective campus security requires solutions for:

- **Emergency Response:** Rapid staff-to-911 communication during active threats
- **Aggression Detection:** Identifying fights, bullying, and violence in restrooms and hallways
- **Air Quality Monitoring:** Protecting student health from environmental hazards
- **Mass Communication:** Facility-wide alerts during lockdowns and emergencies
- **Access Control:** Securing entry points and restricted areas

## Key Insight

The most successful grant applications position vape detection as **one component** of a comprehensive, multi-function safety system rather than a standalone solution. Grantmakers want to fund efforts that address multiple risks and deliver broad benefits for student health and safety.

## Types of Grant Funding Available

The good news: multiple types of grants are available to help schools address vaping and other safety risks—often with a focus on supporting integrated solutions.

### Federal Grants

Federal grants provide the largest funding opportunities but often have more competitive application processes. Key federal programs include:

### State Grants

Many states offer dedicated school safety grant programs with streamlined applications:

- State Department of Education safety grants
- Attorney General school security programs
- Emergency Management Agency pass-through funds
- Department of Health substance prevention grants

### JUUL Settlement Funds

In 2022, JUUL Labs settled with multiple states for **\$462 million**. Many states are allocating these funds specifically for youth vaping prevention, including detection technology. Contact your state Attorney General to learn about fund distribution in your area.

### Local & Regional Grants

- County or city safety initiatives
- Regional educational service agencies
- Local health departments
- Community foundations
- Law enforcement partnerships

## Don't Overlook Smaller Grants

While federal grants may offer larger awards, state and local grants often have less competition, faster turnaround times, and requirements better suited to smaller school districts.

# Strategic Positioning: More Than Vape Detectors

Most grants for vape detectors fall under broader school security technology grants. To maximize your chances of winning, position your request as a comprehensive security solution.

## 5 Fatal Mistakes That Kill Grant Applications

### 1. **Missing Matching Funds:**

Many grants require 25-50% match (can be in-kind). No match = automatic disqualification.

### 2. **No Board Authorization:**

Missing board approval or superintendent signature = instant rejection.

### 3. **Generic Copy-Paste:**

Reviewers spot template language immediately. Customize to grant's specific priorities.

### 4. **Unrealistic Budgets:**

Get actual vendor quotes and include all costs (installation, training, maintenance).

### 5. **Weak Evaluation:**

Need specific metrics, data collection methods, and reporting timelines—not just "track incidents."

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# The Grant Application Process

## Building Your Grant Team

**Key Roles:** Grant Advocate (research, 5-10 hrs/wk) • Project Manager (coordination, 3-5 hrs/wk) • Proposal Writer (drafting, 15-20 hrs/wk) • Budget Specialist (quotes/budgets, 5-8 hrs/wk) • Data Analyst (evidence gathering, 3-5 hrs/wk) • Post-Award Manager (compliance, 5-10 hrs/wk)

## Pre-Application Preparation Checklist

✓ **Read entire RFP/NOFA twice** • Verify eligibility • Note formatting (font, margins, page limits) • List required attachments • Confirm deadline and submission method • Identify evaluation criteria and point values • Determine matching fund requirements • Contact program officer with questions

## Gathering Evidence & Data

**Required Documentation:** Incident data (vaping reports, nurse visits, confiscations) • Student surveys (anonymous prevalence/location data) • Facility assessments (supervision gaps) • Health statistics (local youth vaping rates) • Security audits (existing vulnerabilities) • Stakeholder input (teacher, parent, student concerns) • Comparable data (success stories from similar schools)

## Writing Your Narrative

**Executive Summary (1 page):** Clear problem statement • Proposed solution & funding request • Students/staff benefiting • Key measurable outcomes

**Problem Statement (15-25%):** Data showing vaping prevalence • Impact on learning and climate • Why current approaches fail • Specific locations needing intervention

**Project Description (40-50%):** Technology deployment plan • Number and placement of devices • Integration with existing systems • Alert and response protocols • Training plans • Implementation timeline

**Evaluation Plan (15-20%):** Quantitative metrics with targets • Qualitative measures • Data collection methods • Reporting schedule

**Sustainability Plan (10-15%):** Post-grant funding plans • Ongoing costs and budget allocation • Maintenance strategies • Institutionalization plans

# Proven Success Metrics That Win Grants

Replace vague goals with specific, measurable outcomes that reviewers want to see:

## Incident Reduction

**75%**

Reduction in bathroom vaping incidents within 90 days

## Response Time

**30 sec**

From incident to administrator notification (vs 5+ minutes currently)

## Cost Savings

**\$15K**

Annual vandalism/damage reduction in monitored areas

## Coverage

**100%**

Of privacy-sensitive areas monitored without cameras

## Staff Confidence

**90%**

Report feeling prepared for emergencies after training

## Health Impact

**50%**

Reduction in vaping-related nurse visits per semester

## Pro Tip: Use Baseline Data

Always include current baseline metrics (current incidents, response times, costs) to demonstrate measurable improvement. Example: "Reduce bathroom vaping incidents from current average of 12 per week to 3 per week within first semester."

# ROI Calculator: Justify Your Investment

## Sample ROI Calculation for \$50,000 System

<b>Investment:</b> Comprehensive Detection & Alert System	- \$50,000
<b>Year 1 Savings &amp; Benefits:</b>	
Vandalism/Damage Reduction (documented average)	+\$15,000
Reduced Admin Time (30 hrs/month @ \$35/hr)	+\$12,600
Insurance Premium Discount (5% safety credit)	+\$5,000
Avoided Liability (1 prevented incident)	+\$100,000+
Grant Funding Secured	+\$35,000

### Net Benefit Year 1: \$117,600+

*Note: Does not include intangible benefits like improved learning environment, parent confidence, staff morale, and student health outcomes.*

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# Grant Application Timeline

## 6-8 Weeks Before Deadline

Identify opportunity, read RFP thoroughly, assemble grant team, schedule kick-off meeting

## 5-6 Weeks Before

Gather data and evidence, conduct needs assessment, request vendor quotes, draft problem statement

## 4-5 Weeks Before

Draft project description, develop detailed budget, begin evaluation plan

## 3-4 Weeks Before

Request letters of support, complete budget narrative, draft sustainability plan

## 2-3 Weeks Before

Complete first full draft, internal review by team, revisions based on feedback

## 1-2 Weeks Before

Final edits, gather attachments, obtain signatures, format check

## 3-5 Days Before

Final review, submission test, prepare backup method

## 1-2 Days Before

Submit application, save confirmation, notify team

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# After You Win: Compliance & Implementation

Winning the grant is just the beginning. Proper post-award management ensures you keep the funding and achieve your goals.

## Immediate Post-Award Actions

### First 30 Days After Award

- Review grant agreement thoroughly with legal counsel
- Note all reporting deadlines and requirements
- Understand allowable vs. unallowable costs
- Confirm procurement/bidding requirements
- Set up separate accounting codes for grant expenses
- Schedule kick-off meeting with implementation team
- Contact vendors to confirm quotes and availability
- Develop detailed implementation timeline
- Create reporting calendar with reminders
- Designate grant compliance officer

## Procurement Requirements

Most federal and state grants require competitive procurement:

Purchase Amount	Typical Requirement	Documentation Needed
Under \$10,000	Single quote acceptable	Quote, justification
\$10,000 - \$25,000	3 quotes required	All quotes, selection rationale
\$25,000 - \$100,000	Formal bid process	RFP, bid tabulation, board approval
Over \$100,000	Public bid with advertisement	Complete procurement file

## Reporting Requirements

- **Financial Reports:** Usually quarterly, showing expenses against budget
- **Progress Reports:** Semi-annual or annual, demonstrating outcomes
- **Final Report:** Comprehensive summary of project impact
- **Audit Requirements:** May trigger single audit requirements

## Common Compliance Issues to Avoid

### Compliance Red Flags

- Purchasing items not in approved budget without prior approval
- Missing reporting deadlines (can result in fund suspension)
- Inadequate documentation of expenses
- Using grant funds for unallowable costs (food, travel, etc.)
- Failing to meet match requirements
- Not following procurement procedures

## Budget Modifications

Most grants allow budget modifications with prior approval:

- Changes under 10% between categories: Often allowed without approval
- Changes over 10%: Require written approval from program officer
- Adding new budget items: Always requires prior approval
- Timeline extensions: Request at least 30 days before grant end

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# Alternative Funding Strategies

## JUUL Settlement Direct Distribution

Some states distribute JUUL settlement funds directly to requesting schools. Contact your state Attorney General's office for direct allocation processes.

## Crowdfunding Campaigns

Platforms like GoFundMe and DonorsChoose enable direct community fundraising:

- Create compelling campaign with specific goals
- Include student impact stories (with permissions)
- Provide regular updates on progress
- Leverage social media and local media
- Offer recognition for major donors

## Corporate Sponsorships

Local businesses often support school safety:

- Develop one-page sponsorship proposal
- Highlight community benefit
- Offer naming rights or recognition
- Target businesses with school connections
- Consider tiered sponsorship levels

## Phased Implementation

If full funding isn't available, consider phasing:

1. **Phase 1:** High-priority locations (main bathrooms)
2. **Phase 2:** Locker rooms and additional facilities
3. **Phase 3:** Integrated alerts and communications

Success in Phase 1 strengthens future funding requests.
